### Lutheran Women's Missionary League News

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, our congregation celebrated LWML-C Sunday. We began the service with a video describing how LWML-C motivates, equips and encourages women to reach out in mission as they grow in God's Word, serve God's people and share God's Son. Our theme for this year is "Shine Like Stars...In Your Community and the World (Romans 10:11-17). As we search the Word of the Lord we are given many examples of how we are guided by the Lord. Let the stars in the sky remind you that He is always there with you to give you that hope and assurance that you are His child. May God use our words and actions to tell the Good News of His love and forgiveness as we shine like stars for Him

The LWML-Canada Winnitoba Zone Fall Renewal was held at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church on October 17th. The theme was "Raising Children in the Lord" based on "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it (Proverbs 22:6)." About 50 women attended. In the morning, Pastor James Scholz, our LWML-C Pastoral Advisor led a Bible study entitled "How Do You View Your Children." Following a delicious lunch, we had a violin performance from students of Beautiful Savior Lutheran School, led by Mr. Blaine Badiuk. Jennifer McCrea, principal of BSLS spoke about how the school promotes academic excellence in a faith-based environment. Its purpose is to provide Christ-centered education for children. She talked about how the staff members assist the children with learning, as they grow spiritually, academically, emotionally, physically and socially to become strong, confident and competent adults. A special thanks to the members of our LWML-C society for all their help in making this day a success.

We have completed 15 school kits for Canadian Lutheran World Relief. A kit is something that will brighten a student's life where school supplies are scarce. Packed in "We Care" bags, they are ready for delivery.

Everyone is invited to join our LWML-C meeting, on November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 7:00 pm. Our guest speaker is from Main Street Project (MSP). MSP is a safe and respectful place for individuals at risk in our community. It provides a 24 hour crisis centre, mainstay residence offering emergency shelter and food services, a drug and alcohol detoxification unit and on-site counselling, support and advocacy to those in need. Main Street Project is currently experiencing a need for: hats, mitts, scarves, winter outerwear and footwear, socks (year round), pants (men & women), shirts (men & women), coffee & tea, laundry soap, towels, art & craft supplies, board games & cards. All donations would be greatly appreciated.

Following learning about the programs of Main Street Project, we will begin our "Warm Feet for the Street" mission project for clients at the Main Street Project. It begins with a pair of woollen sock. Roll up one of the woollen socks and place it inside the other sock and fill the sock with men's toiletries (ideas include travel-sized toothpaste, toothbrush, and shampoo; bar of soap, band-aids, deodorant, chapstick, kleenex, writing pad, pen, playing cards, or Christmas candy). We have a Bible tract from the Canadian Bible Society to include in the stocking. Hang your socks on the Christmas tree in

the church entrance.

Once again, on Saturday, November 7<sup>th</sup>, a group of volunteers will be serving at Siloam Mission, for the lunch food program. We were very grateful to those that signed up. Unfortunately, we had more than enough volunteers, but do not be disappointed, we will be looking for your help the next time we are scheduled to serve. Siloam Mission is for Winnipeg's less fortunate – those whose dreams turned into nightmares of addiction, mental illness, unemployment, and powerlessness. Their programs and services bring God's love to those in need.

LWML-C will be celebrating our annual Christmas party on Tuesday, December 1<sup>st</sup> at 6:00 pm with our traditional Chinese food. All ladies from our congregation are welcome to join us. We always have an enjoyable evening, with fellowship and our popular white elephant gift exchange.

Don't forget to drop off any stamps, used eyeglasses, Campbell's soup labels for our school, and drink tabs for a wheelchair for Emma. Thanks to those who have generously helped with our mission projects.
